This granite church located on a small island off Charleston has experienced many interventions in its 125-year history.

A private residence since the 1970s, it underwent significant repair and restoration in 2003, paving the way for a raised solid masonry three and a half-storey extension in 2007.

Interior Designer Renée Killian-Dawson, who worked alongside the young team of architect and contractors, describes the obstacles, challenges, and rewards the team encountered on the journey to create a hurricane-proof castellated tower which looked both to the past and the future for its resilient construction and design.

She currently lives in an ancient timber-framed cottage in Hampshire with her family, with plans to build a Gothic carriage house in a cobbled mews.
